E-commerce module

E-commerce (electronic commerce) is the buying and selling of goods and services on the Internet, especially the World Wide Web. RB Web 8's e-commerce module enables clients to pay invoices (including COD invoices) online via PayPal, a trusted third party for electronic payments, then download transcripts immediately.

Create Account

Signing up with PayPal

For e-commerce, RB Web integrates with PayPal which is the most widely recognized and respected independent third-party company specializing in processing online credit card transactions.

If you don't have a business account with PayPal, create one to accept payments on RB Web.

- 1. Launch your web browser and go to <u>www.paypal.com</u>.
- 2. Click the **Business** tab.
- 3. Click Create Account.
- 4. Click Get Started under the Business category.
- 5. In the I want to sign up for a payment solution drop-down, select Website Payments Pro, then click Continue.



6. Complete the enrollment forms by following the onscreen instructions.

Security

Creating API credentials

An Application Programming Interface (API) allows PayPal to communicate with your RB Web online office directly so your clients do not leave your site to make an online payment. To integrate RB Web's e-commerce with PayPal, generate your API credentials, then add them to your RB Web.

- 1. Launch your web browser and go to <u>www.paypal.com</u>.
- 2. Log in to your account.
- 3. Click **Profile** under the **My Account** tab.
- 4. Click API Access under the Account Information category.
- 5. Click View API Certificate in the Option 2 box.

Option 2 - Request API credentials to create your own API username and password.

This option applies to:

- Custom websites and online stores
- · Pre-integrated shopping carts running on your own server

- 6. Select Request API signature, then click Agree and Submit.
 - Request API signature if your shopping cart or solution provider has asked for an API username, password, and signature, or if you're developing a custom shopping cart.
- 7. On the menu bar in RB8, click **Tools > Web > Site Configurations.**
- 8. Click the **Pay Invoices** tab.

9. Copy API Username, API Password and Signature from the PayPal web page, then paste them into the corresponding fields in RB8.

- 10. Click the Accessibility tab.
- 11. Check the **Allow** box next to **Pay Invoices** (in the Contact Module section) to enable the e-commerce module in RB Web.
- 12. Click Save.

COD Invoices

Publishing COD invoices

In RB8, COD invoices are not posted, so as a default, they do not appear when clients go to the Activity section of RB Web. However, with RB Web's e-commerce module, you have an option to 'publish' COD invoices to allow the clients to pay for and download transcripts that were billed COD.

- 1. On the menu bar in RB8, click **Billing > Cod Invoices.**
- 2. In the Search Criteria pane, specify the filters, then click Search (or press Alt + S).
- 3. RB8 lists all of the COD invoices that meet the specified search conditions. Right-click the invoice(s) you want to publish on RB Web, then choose **Set Publish on Web.**

To 'unpublish' COD invoices, right-click the invoice(s) you want to unpublish on RB Web, then choose **Clear Publish on Web.**

Accessibility

Controlling online transcript access

Before e-commerce was available, any client who was billed for transcripts was able to download transcripts from RB Web whether invoices were paid or not unless invoices were marked COD. With e-commerce now built into RB Web, you can restrict downloads to only those transcripts that are fully paid for.

- 1. On the menu bar in RB8, click **Tools > Web > Site Configurations.**
- 2. Click the **Accessibility** tab.
- 3. In the Contact Module section, under Transcripts, there are two new checkboxes:
 - Allow file downloads when the invoice (original) is fully paid Check this box if the invoices for <u>originals</u> must be fully paid before transcripts can be downloaded. Since originals are normally billed to your good clients, you might want to leave this checkbox blank so as not to irritate your client base.
 - Allow file downloads when the invoice (copy) is fully paid Check this box if the invoices for <u>copies</u> must be fully paid before transcripts can be downloaded. Since copies are normally billed to non-clients, you might want to check this box to improve your collections.

4. Click Save.

Pay Invoices

Paying invoices online

You can now pay invoices (including COD invoices) on RB Web using credit cards. RB Web e-commerce is fully integrated with PayPal for security and convenience.

- 1. Log in to RB Web.
- 2. Click Pay Invoices in the navigation bar.
- 3. In the Pay Invoices screen, all open (unpaid) invoices appear, sorted by invoice number.
- 4. Click the **Pay** checkbox next to each invoice you want to pay.
- 5. Click Pay Invoices.
- 6. In the screen that follows, enter the credit card and billing information, then click Pay Now.

Receivables

Crediting online payments

RB generates payment transactions in Receivables automatically from online PayPal payments made by clients in RB Web.

- 1. When a confirmation is received from PayPal that an online payment has been credited to your business account, a payment transaction will be automatically generated in RB8 crediting invoices selected by clients in step 4 of "Paying invoices online."
- 2. At the end of each day, post these credit card payments along with other payments you entered in Receivables.

Full-text search plug-in

In a full-text search, the search engine examines all of the words in every document stored in a database, as it tries to match search words supplied by the user. However, directly scanning the contents of each document looking for matches is very slow and impractical. Instead, RB Web's full-text search plug-in first scans the text of all the documents and builds a list of search terms, called an index (concordance). Then, when performing a specific search, only the index is referenced rather than the text of the original documents. With this plug-in, your clients can search through hundreds of transcripts belonging to a particular case in a matter of seconds.

Requirements

Is your system ready?

RB Web 8's full-text search plug-in utilizes the string-matching technology available in Microsoft SQL Server. To activate the full-text search plug-in for RB Web 8, your SQL Server must be one of the following:

- SQL Server 2000 Standard or Enterprise Edition
- SQL Server 2005 Workgroup, Standard or Enterprise Edition
- SQL Server 2008 Web, Workgroup, Standard or Enterprise Edition

MSDE 2000 (a free version from Microsoft) does <u>not</u> support full-text search. If you are using MSDE 2000 as your SQL Server, we recommend that you upgrade to SQL Server 2008 Web Edition. It is available from Microsoft for \$15 a month.

Supported document types

Is your document compatible?

For RB8 to scan a document and build an index, the document must be one of the following file types:

- PDF (text portion only)
- MS Word
- MS Excel
- MS PowerPoint
- Rich Text Format (rtf)
- HTML
- All text formats

NOTE

At this time, image files (e.g., scanned exhibits) are not supported. Once we fully implement an Optical Character Recognition (OCR) module (currently under development), RB8 will be able to extract text information from image-based documents.

Full-text search

Create Full-Text

Building an index

The first step in implementing full-text searching is to build an index. This is easy — you just specify a case and file types. RB8 will do the rest.

- 1. On the menu bar in RB8, click **Production > Repository.**
- 2. In the Search Criteria pane, specify the filters, then click **Search** (or press **Alt** + **S**). For example, if your client wants to search through all PDF transcripts belonging to a particular case, enter the following information:
 - File Types Select PDF Transcript in the drop-down.
 - Case Click the binoculars button to select the case.

3. RB8 lists all of the files that meet the specified search conditions. Right-click the file(s) you want to index, then choose **Create Full-Text.**

If the Case field in the Search Criteria Pane is left blank, RB8 will build an index for all PDF transcripts stored in the repository. However, this might take many hours, so it is recommended that you do the initial building during non-business hours.

4. As each file is indexed, the corresponding Full-Text checkbox is marked.

To remove files from the index, right-click the file(s), then choose Remove Full-Text.

Repository Search Searching online repository

Using our full-text search feature, you can now search through hundreds of transcripts in a matter of seconds.

- 1. Log in to RB Web.
- 2. Click Repository Search in the navigation bar.
- 3. Search for transcripts by selecting one or more search filters in the Search Criteria pane:
 - Word(s) to search for Type the word or phrase you are looking for in the box.
 - Search Type Select All of the words, Any of the words or The exact phrase in the drop-down.
- 4. Click Search. All potential matches to the information you entered appear.
- 5. Click the download (arrow) button next to the file you want to view or download.

Media streaming plug-in

With streaming media (audio or video), a web user does not have to wait to download a file to play it. Instead, the media is sent in a <u>continuous</u> stream of data and plays as it arrives. An important advantage of streaming media technology (unlike either traditional or progressive downloads) is the copyright protection it provides. No copy of the content is left on the receiving device. Therefore, the recipient can neither alter nor redistribute the content in an unauthorized manner.

Requirements

Is your system ready?

Providing true media streaming requires specialized software (known as media server software) and dedicated hardware. RB Web 8's media streaming plug-in utilizes *Wowza Media Server* software, which is considered to be one of the best *Flash* streaming server software currently on the market. To provide media streaming in RB Web 8, your media-dedicated system must include the following:

- Dual-core processor computer
- Minimum 1GB of RAM per core
- RAID 0 or RAID 10 configurations with at least 2 or more disks in the array
- · Any Windows operating system
- Java Runtime Environment (JRE) 5 or 6
- Wowza Media Server (see note)
- Port 1935 (RTMP port) opened on your firewall
- *Flash Player* (on clients' computers)

NOTES

RB Web 8's media streaming plug-in comes with **Wowza Pro10** edition (a free version) that supports a maximum of 10 concurrent connections. To provide an unlimited number of concurrent streaming connections, purchase **Wowza Pro Unlimited** edition. It is available from Wowza for \$995.

Flash is an application that creates files that stream their content to browsers very quickly. It is an industry standard for presenting media on the web.

Supported document types

Is your document compatible?

RB Web 8's media streaming plug-in supports the following media types:

- Flash media content (.flv) recommended
- MP3 content (.mp3)
- H.264/HE-ACC media content (.f4v, .mp4, .m4a, .mov, .mp4v, .3gp, and .3g2)

Transcripts

Viewing streaming video

You don't have to wait to receive DVDs; you can view them anytime, anywhere you have Internet access, with the click of a button. You will need *Flash Player* installed on your computer to view videos in streaming mode.

- 1. Log in to RB Web.
- 2. Click **Transcripts** in the navigation bar.
- 3. In the Transcripts screen, any available transcripts and videos (if available) for jobs taken in the past month appear. Search for transcripts by selecting one or more search filters in the **Search Criteria** pane:
 - **Uploaded Date** To see transcripts for different time periods, enter new beginning and end dates, or click the attached calendar buttons and select dates in the pop-up Date Navigator.
 - Case To find transcripts on a specific case, enter part of the case name into the field.
 - Witness To find a specific witness, enter part of the witness's name in the field.
 - Job Date To find transcripts for a specific job date range, enter new beginning and end dates, or click the attached calendar buttons and select dates in the pop-up Date Navigator.
 - Contact To find transcripts for a specific attorney, select one in the drop-down list.
- 4. Click Search.
- 5. All potential matches to the information you entered appear. Click the plus (+) sign in front of the witness name to see the associated files available for viewing.
